

Using IT to Support Learning at Home



Home computers and internet access are integral to the way many children learn at home.

Why?

Provides access to information (which should be sense checked)

Builds computer skills

Develops hand eye co-ordination

Develops skills in specific areas

Makes learning enjoyable – children engage

Mathletics

- Independent learning
- Play against other children in country or world that are logged on (no exchange of details and school based programme only)
- Reinforce and revise previously taught skills
- Teachers set areas / activities appropriate for each child related to learning
- Children collect points to buy tools to adjust their online profile eg fancy backgrounds etc
- Certificates awarded and given in assembly
- Teacher can see areas child has found challenging and can then revisit this in class

Active Learn

- Independent learning that is tailored specifically to what they have been learning that week in maths
- Reinforce and revise previously taught skills
- Children earn points and use them to 'buy' rewards eg decorations for a treehouse
- Teacher can see areas child has found challenging and can then revisit this in class
